

Our church is now open for Mass

it has been decided that from Saturday 12 September onwards, you will not need to obtain a ticket in order to attend Mass. You will just need to turn up for Mass 15 minutes before the start and remain socially distanced whilst queuing.

In order to meet the requirements of track and trace we are asking you to provide your name and contact number on a piece of paper which will be collected by the steward. This will enable us to get people into Mass quickly and on time.

The times of Masses have changed and the number able to attend is limited.

The Mass times are —

11 am Saturday, Sunday and Tuesday,

7.30 pm Thursday

Each Mass will be celebrated as the Sunday Mass.

A maximum of 40 people plus four stewards will be able to attend each Mass.

Church will open 15 minutes before the start of Mass and entry is through the doors on Weir Lane. The back gate to the garden will be open to allow you to get to the car park and Weir Lane.

You will be required to wear a face mask or face covering and to sanitise your hands on entry and exit.

Volunteer stewards will show you to your seat so we can ensure social distancing and comply with the regulations set out by the Bishops' Conference and the Government. Holy Communion will be distributed at the end of Mass as you leave.

It is appreciated that these changes may be difficult but we have to protect our priest, parishioners and the wider community.

We look forward to seeing you again as we gradually return to normal.
